Future harvest in Afghanistan -

In Afghanistan, war and drought have devastated the country's ability to produce its own food. In fact the country now depends on food aid from international donors. To turn that situation around and help Afghanistan revive its farm sector, a group of global research institutes, relief and development organisations, universities and aid agencies have got together to form a Future Harvest Consortium. One person who's going to play a vital role in rebuilding Afghanistan's farm sector is Fared Waliyar. Fared grew up in Afghanistan and is now a plant pathologist with Icrisat, a crop improvement and management company.
